**13. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE**

Apologies were received from Mr L Adsett (Bowling Club), Cllrs. Caplin & Clarke.

**14. MINUTES**

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 13th September 2018 were received, agreed and signed as an accurate record.

**15. REPRESENTATIVES' REPORTS AND ITEMS**

Allotments

Nothing really to report. The Deputy Clerk advised that the plot next to Mr & Mrs Nunns will be worked on w/c 22.10.18.

Cricket Club (PCC)

The cricket pitch has been scarified and re-seeded in preparation for next year. The AGM of the Sussex Cricket League will be held at the end of the month, when a new constitution is to be agreed. There will now be 4 leagues – a Premier league and the remaining leagues will be split into areas – West, Mid & East, it is unsure how this will work in practice.

Snooker Club

There are 2 teams in the league, which has started again and membership is up. The Snooker Club have been able to pay their rent in advance this year.

PFC

The Football Club now has 2 teams as the Patriot players have amalgamated to form a second PFC team. Both teams won last Saturday.

S&SC

All is going well, memberships are due again this month and all membership paperwork has been updated to comply with the new GDPR regulations.

Additional Matters

The advisory representatives were asked if they knew why 2 hazel bushes were planted just outside of the recreation ground, was it to stop balls being kicked/thrown over to the houses. Representatives did not know but Mr T Reilly did comment that it did prevent balls going into resident's gardens. As the hazel bushes are getting a bit thick in places, they really need cutting back, not the height, just the thickness of the branches. Mr T Reilly will go and have a look at the hazel bushes to see if this would cause any problem and report back to the Deputy Clerk. All the other representatives confirmed this would not be a problem.
