## **Chairman's report**

## Another year has nearly passed with some disappointing developments in the Parish.

We have now lost our remaining 2 banks and our post office facilities. Both of these events have put a great strain on the most vulnerable and less able members of our community who now struggle to carry out transactions which, up to now, have been relatively easy to do within the village. Members of the Pulborough Community Partnership are still working closely with the Post Office to find a resolution to those particular facilities but the loss of walk-in banking is an inevitable result of on-line financing I'm afraid, albeit with the consequential loss of a cash machine as well.

However, there have been some heartwarming and encouraging activities which I'm pleased to report.

The lamp post brackets were finally fixed enabling us to have a good show of hanging baskets throughout the summer. The Harvest Fair again showed how well the local people can come together to celebrate community events.

The Trim Trail is still on the agenda; it is just about finalizing the venue which now looks likely to be on the Main recreation ground rather than Cousins Way recreation ground.

It has been approved unanimously by the Parish Council and Horsham District Council will now carry out their own consultation.

As a result of cutbacks within the area policing activities, the Council will shortly be considering the introduction of Community Wardens. Whilst Community Wardens are not the Police, they do provide a reassuring uniformed patrolling presence. Their role can be wide ranging and include dealing with low level anti social behaviour, engagement with schools and youth clubs, liaison with the Police using appropriate communications, supporting the community by offering assistance to elderly, vulnerable and isolated member as well as the ability to exercise powers such as to stop cycles, to require persons aged under 18 to surrender alcohol and the power to seize tobacco from a person under 16.

The Parish Council will shortly be looking at the financial and logistical practicalities of joining with Billingshurst in taking this idea forward. There is funding available for this project but if we do, after consultation with the community, decide to go ahead, then there will need to be a small increase to our precept. Inevitably there will be an increase in your parish rates but this will be kept to the absolute minimum and in any event any increase should not exceed £4 per year for the average Band D rated property.

## **Byelaws**

Did you know that the Main Recreation Ground, Cousins Way Recreation Ground, Pocket Park, Masons Way play area and Nutbourne Common Recreation Ground are covered by Byelaws which are enforceable by law? Any person offending against any of the Byelaws may be removed from the Grounds by an Officer of the Council or a constable and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine.

The full bye laws can be viewed at the sports pavilion and also on the gate to the Cousins Way Recreation Ground and include, amongst others, the following prohibitions:-

- no tents or caravans
- no fires (which includes barbecues)
- no horse riding
- no golf
- no model aircraft
- no metal detectors



If you see a crime being committed or if you feel in danger, call 999. Alternatively, you can report incidents anonymously to Crime Stoppers 0800 555 111 . In this way the police can build up a dossier of information which will enable them to catch the culprits.

# **Neighbourhood Plan update**

You will recall that over the summer, residents and Consultees were invited to comment on the draft of the Pulborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan (PPNP). The comments received have been noted and assessed and the PPNP has been updated where applicable in line with the responses received. The next step is for the final Plan to be submitted to Horsham District Council (HDC) to take the process forward.

This is a major milestone after almost two years of hard work by our volunteers, and as Chair of the Steering Group I am grateful to everyone in Pulborough who has given their time and energy to help us reach this point. From the outset we have made a concerted effort to ensure that the PPNP serves the interests and reflects the views of the majority of residents of the parish, and the many thoughtful responses provided by residents to our various consultations have been extremely helpful.

The key elements of Pulborough's Neighbourhood Plan as submitted to HDC may be summarised as follows:

1. Maintain the physical separation of the parish's five settlements (Pulborough Village, Codmore Hill, Nutbourne, Marehill and North Heath) and restrict development to brownfield sites within the built-up area.

- 2. Deliver approximately 150 new houses across three sites and create a Community Land Trust to address local social need.
- 3. Develop the parish's economy and local employment by promoting the development of sites for retail, commercial and tourism use.
- 4. Protect and enhance the parish's heritage and rural character, not only by limiting development to brownfield sites within the built-up area but also by designating local green spaces and ensuring new developments follow design principles sympathetic to local character and setting.
- 5. Protect community facilities and provide for their future improvement, in particular the redevelopment of the existing Sports Pavilion.

The Steering Group and Parish Council believe the plan is a positive and wellevidenced strategy for the sustainable development of the parish. It provides a level of housing appropriate to the infrastructure and services available in the plan period, and at the same time encourages economic development to provide the employment and investment necessary to the sustainability of future growth. It protects and enhances Pulborough's rural character and heritage whilst strengthening the village's important role as a service centre. Perhaps most importantly, we believe it promotes the interests and reflects the wishes of the majority of residents of the parish.

We encourage all residents to comment on the plan during the next 6-week statutory consultation which we expect HDC to kick off in the coming weeks. Whether you wish to express your opposition or your support, it is important that you take this opportunity to have your say as it will be your last before the plan is put to a referendum.

### Follow the LEADER to rural business success

#### Rural businesses across Sussex now have the chance to apply for their share of £3.2m in EU and Government funding.

The LEADER programme, announced by the Department for Environment Food and Rural Affairs, will provide grants to small businesses, farmers, foresters and communities for projects that create jobs and grow the rural economy.

Funding has been allocated to two Local Action Groups (LAGs):

- £1.5m for the Sussex Downs & Coastal Plain LAG covering rural areas of Chichester District, Arun District and Hayling Island; and
- £1.7m for the Central Sussex LAG covering rural areas of Horsham District, Mid Sussex District and Lewes District.

Both LAGs are made up of local people and organisations with knowledge of rural issues and their communities. They will decide which projects to fund.

The process will be supported by West Sussex County Council.

The previous LEADER scheme supported 153 projects and created 141 new jobs between 2008 and 2013. The new scheme will carry on the good work from now until 2020.
