Chairman's report

The main theme of my Report for this quarter concerns the Neighbourhood Wardens.

The 2 year trial period of their employment finishes at the end of March 2018 and consideration will soon have to be given by the Council to extending the present contract or discontinuing their employment.

All the indications are that their continued presence in and around the village will be extremely beneficial for all concerned particularly in controlling unruly and antisocial behaviour; indiscriminate parking and in providing help with the elderly and vulnerable members of our Parish.

It is the Council's intention therefore to continue to fund the Neighbourhood Wardens.

The Council has essentially funded the costs to date from its cash reserves that have built up over the years.

The Council will continue to fund from reserves where it can but has to be prudent in ensuring that it still retains sufficient funds within those reserves to cope with extreme situations should they arise.

Some proportion of any future costs have to be met by increasing the precept and by definition the local rates.

Therefore in respect of the Neighbourhood Wardens, there is likely to be an increase of approximately £4.76 per year for a Band D property in 2018/2019 and a further increase of £6.94 per year in 2019/2020.

The Council is nevertheless mindful that there may be concerns that the Neighbourhood Warden Scheme is an unnecessary burden upon local ratepayers. Should anyone feel strongly against continuing the scheme or have any other comments that they wish to make, then please do not hesitate to contact the Parish Clerk by the 30th September at the latest.

Other items of news

The Council has short-listed its preferred Contract Managing companies to build the new pavilion; Fred Bushby, our Groundsman, is now full-time, albeit currently within a trial period; Our Deputy Clerk, Lisa Underwood, has recently attained the CiLCA qualification (Certificate in Local Council Administration); congratulations to her.

As part of its Neighbourhood Plan process, the Steering Group continues to meet with representative bodies locally and land owners to ensure that the evidence base is sound when the Plan goes forward for examination.

The Council does not meet again until September due to the holiday period so I would like to take this opportunity to wish all those parishioners who are holidaying in August the very best of the weather!

St Mary's CofE (Aided) Primary School

What a term this has been and as it comes to a close there are so many fantastic opportunities for the children to report on. There have been a variety of trips out for enrichment days and these have included Marwell Zoo where the children saw a range of animals and explored the grounds. Year one children went to Aldingbourne Country Centre where they explored habitats, made their own nests, fed and handled the animals and the Year 5 children had their own adventure on a submarine at Submarine Museum – a fascinating day out and one that we will certainly repeat.

The Year 5 and 6 children were also fortunate to have a visit from authors Mark Huckerby and Nick Ostler who are an Emmy-winning and BAFTA-nominated writing partnership. They have scripted hundreds of episodes of popular TV shows such as Danger Mouse, Thunderbirds are Go and Shaun the Sheep. They have written 'Defenders of the Realm' and we were really keen for them to come and share it with us! This presentation really inspired many of the children with their writing and reading. Our own award winning production is well

underway and the children have loved this performance of Aladdin. They are a real credit with their acting skills!

In addition to this it was great to see the Country Dancers in Horsham Park, all dancing together and our very strong cricket team representing St Mary's School at many different events across the locality. Another highlight of the summer term at St Mary's has been the continued use of our very own swimming pool. We would like to say a very special thank you to everyone who has supported our fundraising events which allowed us to replace the boilers so that the children were not swimming in icy waters! The St Mary's PTA, the Anchorage Care Home and West Sussex Police have all been extremely generous.

Our Year 6 children have finished their primary careers with their annual production in the Big Top. This production of Aladdin Trouble was well received with over 800 people attending over three days. This was in true pantomime style with cheers, laughter and innuendoes. The Year 6, led by Bishop Martin attended a Leavers' service at Chichester Cathedral.



Parents were invited to attend and it was great to see so many schools from the Diocese attending. They then attended their Hawaiian Summer Ball and this was a chance to really let their hair down! An array of cars adorned our playground as well as a horse and trap and husky dogs with sled. We would like to wish our Year 6 children all the best in their new adventures as they head off to their new secondary schools.

In September we are looking forward to welcoming our new Foundation Stage children. They have already begun their transition from pre-school to St Mary's and in order to help them settle in quickly we have hosted a range of special events for them. The Fairtrade Mark Matters



Pulborough Fairtrade group has been campaigning on Fairtrade issues for twelve years! Initially to help Pulborough gain Fairtrade Village status from the Fairtrade Foundation, achieved for the first time in 2007, this has been renewed every two years since then. So your community continues to show its concern for producers in the developing world and is still a Fairtrade Village, the first in West Sussex.

Despite reports in the national press from some supermarkets, the Fairtrade Mark is still the only way to guarantee producers get a fair price for the goods they grow and a premium to spend on community projects of their choice. They are the ones best placed to know what will most benefit their people. So please continue to look for the Fairtrade Mark when you shop.

Our group will have a stall at Pulborough's Harvest Fair on 23rd September and we can also be found at Pulborough's Village Markets (held in the Village Hall on the fourth Saturday of the month (except August) from 10am to 12.30) where we sponsor a Traidcraft Stall which sells only items carrying the Fairtrade Mark.
