CPN: Community Protection Notice – The CPN is aimed at stopping a person, business or organisation committing persistent and continuing unreasonable behaviour that spoils the community's quality of life, by targeting those responsible.

ASB crime/criminal damage

- Intelligence given to Police directly resulted in two young people being arrested for motorcycle thefts in Pulborough and surrounding areas.
- A female was reported to be acting suspiciously in an Estate Agents. Intelligence shared and it has been linked to other similar cases of distraction theft occurring in the district.
- Reports received of incidents of egg throwing at different locations; including moving vehicles along the A29. Police were informed and some young people responsible have been identified. Local shops have been advised to not sell eggs to children if not accompanied by an adult.
- Reports received of damage to wing mirrors to parked vehicles in New Place Road.
- New metal ASB signs have been erected in various locations to encourage residents to report incidents.

Parking/vehicles

- A CPN (Community Protection Notice) was issued to Domino's business premises for continued poor parking and breaching parking restrictions. Alternative parking arrangements for staff and delivery drivers have been offered to help alleviate the problem.
- 3 x parking notices and a verbal warning given to owners of vehicles repeatedly parking on pavement and causing an obstruction. The area is being monitored and parking has since improved.
- We assisted a resident where a vehicle had parked across and blocked the entrance to their driveway.
- We helped with a guery over a suspected abandoned vehicle. The matter has since been resolved.
- Advise was given to a resident following damage to their vehicle.

Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

- 2 x potholes reported in Church Street and Gay Street Lane.
- 3 x fly tipping incidents reported for collection:
 - 1. Lower Street Car park (Recycling bins).
 - 2. On road entrance to the White Hart Pub.
 - 3. Near Swan Bridge.
- Graffiti removed from waste bin located at the train station bus stop.
- Reported missing Highways bollard near a junction on A283.

Community engagement/events/meetings

- We attended a welcome return of the December Farmers Market for our 'meet and greet' session and was joined by a PCSO to deliver awareness of current fraud/scams that are circulating.
- Attended the Weald School Council meeting to ask for help in identifying areas where young people
 feel safe or unsafe when they are out in the communities. A questionnaire will be completed by
 pupils and the findings will help us to put measures in place to improve safety at any areas
 highlighted.
- Attended multi-agency meeting to discuss welfare concerns of a vulnerable young person.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

- We complete mobile patrols of the entire parish during every shift and target hot spot areas associated with ASB.
- Increased foot patrols to check open spaces i.e. recreation grounds/playground equipment and to engage with groups gathering.
- Visits to homes/businesses keeping within social distancing guidelines.
- Joint patrols with parking services and the Police to engage with parents at the school and to promote safer parking at drop off and collection times.
- Patrols at bus stops/train station to meet pupils travelling to and from the Weald School and colleges.

Elderly and youth

- A joint visit with the Community Mental Health Team to assist a vulnerable resident to receive support.
- We attended a meeting at Weald School in order to complete a mapping exercise to look at friendship groups/associations of young people of concern and their movements within the district.
- We assisted the ASB caseworker with a one 2 one session with a Weald School pupil to talk through behaviour concerns and staying safe when out in the community.
- We worked with a resident to offer ongoing support to a vulnerable older person in need of help with shopping.
- Resident signposted to Age UK for befriending calls and further support.

 We visited a farm to give words of advice about concerns that their dog escapes from their land boundary.

Cycling

Nothing to report.

Parish specific/other

- Early discussions with local social prescriber about starting a 'Walk and Talk' service. Ideas are around linking elderly residents with volunteers to help address loneliness, assist with mobility issues and improve general wellbeing.
- Delivered a broken pedal cycle that we found fly tipped on the A29 to 'Mike the Bike' charity bike shop in Slinfold. Bikes are repaired to be sold and shipped to Kenya and Uganda.
- We delivered a street briefing session outside Tesco's to engage with customers and give out
 information about the latest Governments guidance and the new Covid Tier systems in place. This
 was alongside partner agencies Environmental Health and Trading Standards officers who visited
 local businesses to offer guidance and support.
- Arranged for Terracycle bins to be placed at Dyke Farm for recycling of crisp packets, biscuits and cake wrappers.
- We have linked up on some shifts with our warden colleagues from Storrington and Billingshurst to provide joint patrols in all Parishes to help tackle cross village anti-social behaviour.
