ASB/crime/criminal damage

- Information shared via an open E-cins case with housing provider and other agencies relating to an ongoing neighbour dispute and complaints of anti-social behaviour.
- Advice given to residents on reporting social distancing breaches.
- DPA set up for areas in Pulborough following information shared to the Police.

Parking/vehicles

- Complaint re vehicle parked on double yellow lines. No trace of vehicle.

Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

- 1 x report of fly tipping in front garden. Turned out to be a mis-delivery of tyres.
- 1 x report of discarded sharps box on public footpath. Collected by cleansing team.

Community engagement/events/meetings

- None directly however we have produced a weekly newsletter that we're delivering to households that we know have vulnerable residents and who may not have internet access. Very well received.
- We have been utilising the volunteers to check on residents in their own particular roads where they live in order to identify anyone needing support.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

- Mobile patrols to cover entire parish at least once a day.
- Hot spot areas targeted for COVID-19 breaches and reports of drug related incidents.
- Foot patrol to cover the main recreation ground to ensure play park and gym remain closed off and to engage with people tempted to use it.

Elderly and youth

- Supported 48 vulnerable people during COVID-19 with shopping and medication queries.
- Fitted a link alarm urgently in conjunction with a family member concerned for a vulnerable resident.
- We are working with the Proactive Care Team at the Pulborough medical centre who have referred patients who are shielding and would benefit from befriending calls by our hub volunteers.
- Reassurance calls are made to maintain contact with families and young people.
- Liaising with partner agencies to plan how support will be delivered to young people not in school and throughout the summer period whilst working within the government guidelines in place.

Dog related issues

- Dog fouling reports received on main recreation ground but nothing of note found. Enlisted the help of 2 x volunteers to keep an eye on the area whilst walking their own dogs in order to monitor the situation.
- Further reports received of a dog not under proper control despite being issued with a Community Protection Warning. Working with residents to get evidence to issue a Community Protection Notice and fine.

Parish specific/other

- During April we continued to support residents during the COVID-19 lockdown.
