
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YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

What's in your drain?

Southern Water are bringing to the attention of all residents the recent blockages in the sewer system serving the area.

Reports from Southern Water's Operation Teams confirm that the blockages have often been caused by fat, which has subsequently passed through the system and obstructed the sewer. In light of the recent problems, Southern Water are asking all residents to be particularly aware of what is put down the drains.

Other items such as kitchen roll, paper hand towels and wet wipes should also be disposed of in the bin as these are also a major cause of sewer blockages.

Pulborough Society

The Society was formed in 1973 as a local charity and is a non-political organisation whose aim is to encourage and establish public interest in the local area. The Society is a statutory consultee on all planning issues in the village, and is a forum for local members who might wish to express their concerns regarding architectural design and planning. The Society acts as a coordinating body co-operating with the local authorities and statutory bodies, including volunteer organisations and any persons who have similar aims to the society.

The Society also: -

- Collects local historic information and where possible publishes reports and literature about the area.
- Holds meetings, lectures and exhibitions.
- Where possible gives advice and information to the general public.

Membership is open to all with a current fee of £8.00 for annual membership.

The Society holds seven lively meetings a year and provides a newsletter before each meeting. Meetings are held in the village hall, and this allows members to discuss any concerns they might have and how the society can help. It's also an occasion to catch up with friends and neighbours and meet new people.

Coach trips to places of interest are also arranged throughout the year. The dates for 2015 are 9th September (7.30pm), 7th October (7.30pm) and 11th November (2pm). The guest speakers at the meetings are always interesting and diverse; if you are a non-member and would like to go along and see if the Society had anything to offer you, they charge £2.

Scams & frauds

The Sussex Police and Crime Commissioner (SPCC) is concerned that older people are being deliberately targeted by criminals because of their possible vulnerability to scams and frauds. There have also been reports of older people subjected to psychological and physical abuse. In order to better understand the problems, the SPCC has appointed a Commission to investigate the facts. These will be collated and it is then hoped that the Police will be better able to take appropriate action to protect those at risk. All aboard the Pulborough Minibus!

For any who may not be aware, and as a reminder to those who are, the Pulborough Minibus is an extremely valuable resource for the village and is proving to be a great asset for those who do not have a means of transport of their own. For a modest fare members enjoy a door to door service as opposed to having to wait at bus stops in all weathers. Volunteer drivers and escorts are on hand to ensure the safety of the passengers and a pleasant social occasion is enjoyed by all!

We undertake regular trips to Horsham on 1st and 3rd Mondays and Chichester on 2nd and 4th Mondays in the month. There are also weekly local trips to Sainsbury's and Tesco on Tuesdays. the Village Hall for Lunch and Wednesday Clubs on Wednesdays and local village shops on Fridays plus a monthly run to and from Pulborough Village market on 4th Saturday in the month. Pulborough Ambulance station

Over the coming months you may notice a change at the ambulance station in Moat Lane.

Currently, Ambulance Stations have to provide facilities for all Ambulance activities from refuelling, cleaning, stocking, vehicle repairs etc. However, a new Make Ready Centre (MRC) will be operational at Tangmere, near Chichester from Summer/Autumn 2016 and this MRC will handle all aspects of the maintenance of the vehicles currently carried out at the various Ambulance Stations and will have dedicated staff for these roles.

However, be reassured that locations such as Pulborough, that currently have an Ambulance Station, will continue to have an Ambulance Community Response Post (ACRP). The crews will collect their ready vehicles from the MRC and then standby at the ACRPs. Therefore, although the Ambulance Station in Moat Lane will close in due course (it is the wrong location for an ACRP in the middle of a housing estate), the current plan is to relocate to a new ACRP within the area in the near future and a new location is currently being sought.





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
