Chairman's report

The elections are coming!

Whilst you may all know that on 7th May electors will go to the polls in the General Election, did you know that on the same day, residents will have the opportunity to vote for their Parish Councillors for the next four years?

For the last two Parish Council elections (2011 and 2007), there have been fewer candidates than seats (there are currently 15 seats on Pulborough Parish Council) and therefore no actual poll has been required. In this case, Councillors were deemed to have been elected through an "Uncontested Election". Any vacancies after an Uncontested Election may be filled by Co Option.

Parish precept 2015 to 2016

Council Tax payers will soon be receiving notification of their 2015-16 tax demand for West Sussex County Council, Horsham District Council, Sussex Police and Pulborough Parish Council.

The portion of the bill paid to Pulborough Parish Council (the precept) is under 5% of the total bill. For the 2015/16 year the Parish Council has agreed to a small increase in the demand which equates to 72 pence per annum for a Band D property. However, the Council hope that they will still be able to provide their full range of services to the community, despite rising costs and new commitments.

One major expenditure will be in respect of the Sports and Social Club building on the main recreation ground. This structure is badly in need of a considerable amount of work and the Parish Council hoped that Horsham District Council would aid them financially in the public work from what is known as the Government's "New Homes Bonus". This has not materialised and the Parish Council will now have to finance

modest improvements, mainly from their reserves.

New equipment will also be needed in order to support the growing number of people using the recreation ground and the associated sports and games facilities, including very active soccer, cricket, stoolball and snooker clubs.

The Parish Council also financially supports over twenty local charities who, in turn, provide help and services for a wide range of Pulborough residents from the youngest to the oldest.

The Neighbourhood Plan, the blueprint for Pulborough's future, is progressing well thanks to the dedicated work of the Parish Council's office staff and volunteers.

It is important to note that Parish Councillors are not paid for their services and do not receive any form of attendance allowance in respect of meetings or other duties which they perform.

The Parish Council finances are audited by an independent professional body and are open to public examination. Comments from residents are always welcome either direct to the Clerk or at the Annual Parish Meeting on 14th May in the Village Hall.



Winston's Wish in West Sussex

Winston's Wish is the leading childhood bereavement charity in the UK, helping children and young people rebuild their lives after the death of their mum, dad, brother or sister, and enabling them to face the future with confidence and hope.

In West Sussex, Winston's Wish run a unique bereavement support program called SWITCH. The program is aimed at children aged 8-14 who have suffered a close family bereavement which is having a negative effect on their behaviour. The bereavement may not be recent but may still be having an impact on the child. The SWITCH program offers family work. individual work for children and their carers and group work. We end the program with a celebration day. The aim of SWITCH is to provide children and families with the opportunity to work through their experience with qualified professionals and to help them make sense of their emotions and feelings, meet other people in similar situations and provide them with coping strategy to help them reach their full potential.

SWITCH has been running in West Sussex now for two years and feedback from both children and their carers has been very positive.

Feedback from a mother after the SWITCH program: "She's like a different girl. I can't explain it – it's like she has grown up. She's excellent. I think being able to talk about her feelings and listen to the others and what they do when they get one on them has really helped her. She still gets grumpy, but now takes herself off to her room and listens to music and when she's calmer, then I go and talk to her!"
