ASB/crime/criminal damage

- Support and guidance given to resident with a tenancy dispute. Situation has escalated to Police involvement.
- Continued engagement with local PCSO regarding local matters.
- Out of area drugs intelligence reported to Police.
- 2 x intelligence partnership forms submitted regarding suspected drug dealing.

Parking/vehicles

- Numerous complaints received re: Moped driven anti-socially.
- Yellow warning notice left on vehicle parked on the pavement in Rivermead.
- Referral to Police regarding suspicious vehicle in stream lane.
- Campervan parked in residential street with people living in it. Police informed.
- 1 x Operation crackdown report submitted.
- Resident signposted to Police following a road traffic collision.
- 10 x COVID-19 breach complaints received. Reported to Op Apollo (Sussex Police response)

Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

- Large gas canister removed from the river at Stopham bridge.
- Resident signposted to report fly tipping found on the roadside.

Community engagement/events/meetings

- Weekly newsletter designed for vulnerable residents to include care homes and given to local club organisers to distribute.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

- Mobile patrols of the whole parish during every shift targeting hot spot areas.
- Foot patrols are limited to checking open spaces i.e. recreation grounds and playground equipment.

Elderly and youth

- Further support for a vulnerable male. His dementia diagnosis has contributed to him breaching COVID-19 guidelines. Family informed and advised.
- Visit to family struggling to manage their child's behaviour at home during school closure. Liaised with school and other services to provide additional support.
- Liaised with Sussex clubs for young people (youth work providers) to help promote virtual youth club sessions and plan future activities throughout the summer period.
- Weekly catch up with the ASB team to discuss young people/families that require intervention and support.
- Resident signposted to anxiety support group with mental health concerns.
- Concern for elderly female who lives alone and was confused. Family informed and advice given.

Licensing

- Nothing to report.

Dog related issues

- No new reports received. Volunteers continue to highlight problem areas with temporary spray paint.

Cycling

- Nothing to report.

Parish specific/other

- The Pulborough Volunteer Hub continues to support residents in need of help with pharmacy deliveries, shopping collections and befriending calls. Revised hours/days to Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 09:00 – 1700 is working well and managing to meet the demand.
- Fortnightly Skype meetings to Hub support. Updates and experiences shared for good practise and preparing for the next phase in continuing the support for people still self - isolating or shielding. It is encouraging that our volunteers wish to remain active in our communities and we will play a part in helping to facilitate this.
- Overgrown public footpath reported to PROW (Public Rights of Way) by Toat Café.
- Fallen tree in pocket park reported to groundsman and was removed.
- Further complaint about a resident's overgrown hedge impeding the footpath and rubbish bins left in the road. Housing provider and HDC informed.
- Signposted resident to Saxon Weald Housing regarding land access issues at the rear of their property.
