Many of you may have noticed the extension of the 30 mph speed limit on Codmore Hill just north of Sainsburys. This is something that the Parish Council have campaigned for in the past and I am glad to see that it has been carried out.

Plans are taking place to re-locate the Police Station from its present position in Lower Street but the proposed new site has still to be finalized.

The playing fields, children's play area and fitness trail are all looking in fine shape and it is heartening to see all the areas being used, especially by families.

It is a pity, however, that the District Council is unable to support us financially in rebuilding a fit-for-purpose new Sports Pavilion to enhance those facilities.

We have not given up hope completely however and will continue to explore all other areas of funding to support the project.

Our hanging baskets in Lower Street are really struggling to survive in this current spell of hot weather. However, they are being watered daily by our staff and we would welcome any local residents in Lower Street who feel that they can do likewise; they cannot get too much water!

We are continuing to work diligently on the Neighbourhood Plan, although progress to suit all consultees and other interested parties is painfully slow.

We are arranging an event shortly to commemorate the WW1 Centenary Silhouette Scheme and as a result will be funding the purchase of silhouettes to install alongside entrances to the

# New walking trail for Pulborough to boost tourism and local economy

Pulborough is getting an investment of almost £200,000 from the European Union's Agriculture Fund for Rural Development Programme (EAFRD) to support rural tourism. The funding comes via the government's Rural Payments Agency through a grant application fronted by Horsham District Council's Economic Development team.

The funds will be used to create a four kilometre (approximately 2.5 miles) walk starting from Pulborough Station, along the Cinder Path, Church Place, Old Rectory Lane, East Glebe Field, Lower Street, Barn House Lane, across the Wildbrooks and to the RSPB Pulborough Brooks nature reserve. The trail will be designed to be walked from either end or in sections.

The walk, initially called the WildArt Trail, will be marked throughout by high quality sculptures, way markers and information boards highlighting the local history and wildlife along the way. This will be supported by an electronic app which will be developed for walkers to find out more information about the walk, countryside, wildlife and local history and points of interest. The app will also be an educational tool for younger audiences and will include a bespoke treasure trail.

The project will be managed by a Steering Group with partners from:

Horsham District Council, RSPB, Pulborough Community Partnership, Pulborough Parish Council and the South Downs National Park.

The children's component will be supported by entertaining Augmented Reality (AR). Along the trail, children will meet and interact with 3D augmented characters, encouraging them to engage with wildlife and nature. The inclusion of AR within the app will be a unique feature point, which will maximise the potential to attract more visitors to use the trail and visit Pulborough.

The concept for the trail was started by Pulborough Community Partnership director Rob Aylott working with chairman Roger Paterson and David Hurst, with the intention of increasing footfall in the Lower Street retail area. The idea expanded with inspiration from tourist development work done elsewhere in the country and enthusiasm from others as they heard of the idea.

Rob Aylott said "Pulborough is right in the heart of rural West Sussex and on the centre of the north boundary of the South Downs National Park. We have a rail station and two A roads so it seems a natural idea to develop a tourism element to the local economy. The simple idea of having a quiz for visiting children expanded to the

concept that we now have planned.

"Pulborough has more than 40 listed buildings and a history going back to the Romans and earlier," he continued. "The Wildbrooks and the River Arun are vital to the well-being of the residents and a major reason for living here."

David Hurst added "The RSPB Pulborough Brooks reserve is the largest tourism destination in the District and one of the most biodiverse areas in the country. It is a no-brainer to connect the village to the Reserve using the wonderful footpaths across the Wildbrooks. Add to that the rail and bus access to the village and the whole trail becomes possible."

Ray Quested, Chairman of Pulborough Parish Council, commented: "The trail is something completely different for Pulborough and will give the village and surrounding areas a real boost, bringing more visitors to the area, especially families, and encouraging them to stay for longer and as a result spend more money when they are here.

"It provides an excellent opportunity for our tourism economy businesses – food and drink, accommodation and visitor attraction providers which in turn will help the whole village economy."

It is proposed to have the trail up and running by Summer 2019 to coincide with Horsham District's Year of Culture.

# Fairtrade County Celebration

#### Early in 2018 West Sussex became a Fairtrade County thanks to the hard work of Fairtrade West Sussex and West Sussex County Council. A celebration

took place on 17th May in Edes House, Chichester and was attended by the county town's newly appointed Mayor, Martyn Bell; Louise Goldsmith, leader of West Sussex County Council and council members; representatives of the Fairtrade towns in the county, including Pulborough; and many members of the public who supported a very successful and enjoyable evening.

John Figgins, head of West Sussex County Council catering services, presented an update of Fairtrade activity in the County Council. All the catering services now include Fairtrade options, from Meals on Wheels, corporate catering, and school meals. John said that the pressures on council finances were sometimes given as a reason for not selecting Fairtrade. However, there is no longer a significant extra cost with Fairtrade products. John has been a very keen supporter of Fairtrade since hearing Greg Valerio speak movingly at last year's Fairtrade event in Pulborough about the difference Fairtrade gold makes to poor producers in that industry.

Amy Sim, general manager of Chichester cathedral, gave a lively talk about the



Fairtrade gold weather vane on Chichester cathedral, describing the 3 foot cockerel covered in 3 micron thin Fairtrade gold leaf, processed in Italy, before being installed up a 146 foot ladder during scheduled spire maintenance. Amy also said the cathedral's café now served Fairtrade teas and she would consult with John Figgins on changing to Fairtrade coffee.

Fairtrade West Sussex asked that the county border road-signs should display "Welcome to West Sussex, a Fairtrade County". The West Sussex council cabinet member for roads and transport, Bob Lanzer, offered to add this to the standards for implementation when these signs are replaced and mentioned the possibility of temporary stickers on existing signs. So do keep a look-out for these signs!
