**17. REPORTS FROM COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLORS**

The County Councillor was not in attendance, the Clerk explained that a report has been circulated beforehand.

District Report:

Recent planning applications have been approved, and the local plan continues to progress. There are three local plans from other Districts under consideration, but it is hoped that Horsham DC are to aim to finalise their plan by May next year. It is crucial to ensure these plans are in place before other Councillors submit additional proposals. The upcoming general election will not impact their timelines.

HDC has allocated £5 million for temporary accommodation for refugees. This funding, most of which is through Central Government, is a significant boost and will help the District provide necessary support and shelter.

Starting March 31st next year, we will allocate £5,000 for containers to manage domestic food waste weekly. By March 2026, we aim to address residual food waste as required by the Environmental Act 2021. For isolated properties, we will deploy electric vehicles to ensure efficient waste collection, even from difficult-to-access locations.

The Drill Hall in Horsham will be sold, with the Life Spring Church scheduled to take over in October 2024. This transition is part of our broader strategy to optimise community resources.

There is now a new Chair of the Council, with Nigel Emery stepping into the role. This change does not replace CEO Jane Eaton, who will continue to serve.

Fly-tipping has increased, particularly due to the new time slot restrictions at the WSCC tips.

The Committee wished to add a special thanks to Councillors Clarke and John for their efforts in requiring conditions on St. Crispins Church planning decision.

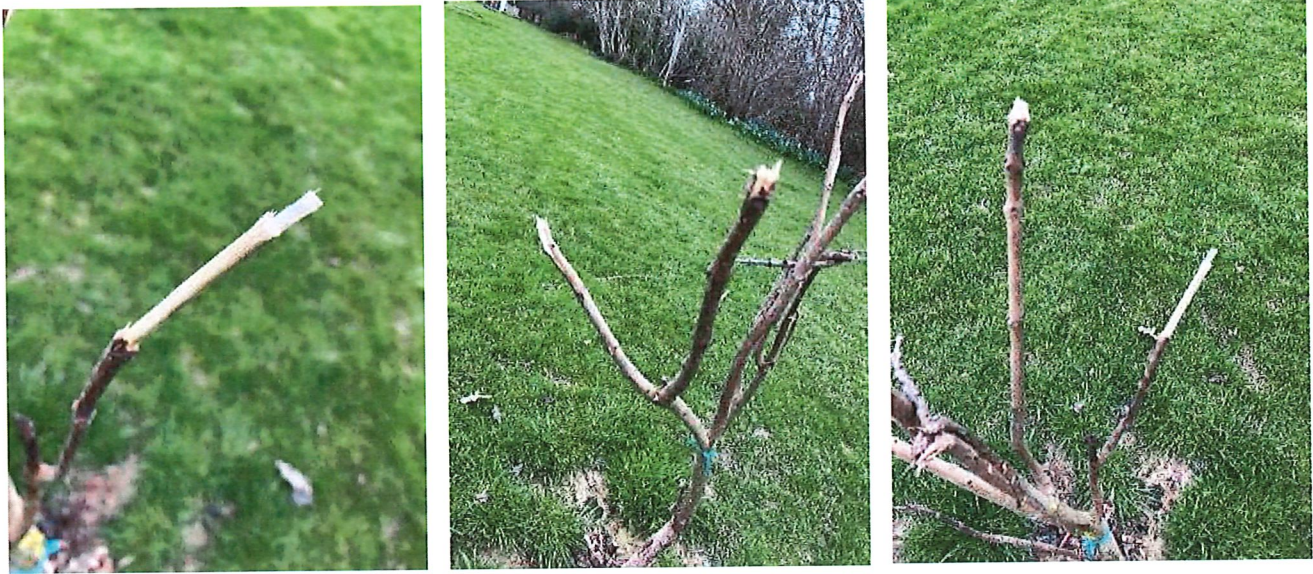

We were incredibly sad to find there has been deliberate damage caused to a tree planted on the recreation ground. Each branch has had the end broken off. This tree was planted in memory of a late Pulborough resident, and the damage caused is extremely disrespectful.

We received a report that a local resident had walked past two young males on Rectory Lane and that one of the males had poured their drink over the resident in an unprovoked encounter. We believe from comments made that the two males are brothers. We carried out a reassurance visit to the resident and have carried out CCTV enquiries.







Criminal damage was caused to the Parish Council bus stop at New Place Road during the evening of Tuesday 26th March. The damage we believe was caused by a catapult. Due to the nature of this anti-social act we had to spend more than 2 hours clearing away the broken glass the following day so that the bus stop could be re-opened.

### Monday Hub

The Hub at Pulborough Library continues to be a warm and inviting place for residents to meet and to help prevent social isolation. Around 25 people attend, and we continue to receive a positive welcome, answering questions and checking on older residents' welfare.



The hub operates when the library is closed to the public on Monday mornings between 10am and midday.

### **Craft Cafe**

We visited the Craft Café on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> March and as usual it was a hive of crafty activity. Next year is the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this wonderful group and the ladies have begun to make the most beautiful bunting in preparation of celebrations. The amazing talent we have in Pulborough really shines through. Again, we thank them for their hospitable welcome.

## **Patrols (foot/visible and car)**

Due to the anti-social behaviour mentioned above we have been focusing our patrols in these areas of the village and as we do each month, we have focused our vehicle patrols on the fly tipping hotspots on the more rural roads of the parish and checked that the carriageways are kept clear of debris.

## **Older, Vulnerable People and Youth**

### **Older/Vulnerable People**

On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> March we met with village agents from Age UK - Hayley & Megan – Sometime ago Age UK launched a group for men in Horsham called the Silver Bullet, which runs on the first Thursday every month at The Coot. The group has proved extremely successful and following on from this of the group Age UK would like to launch the Silver Bullet in Pulborough. We have visited the new landlord at The Oddfellows Arms who has agreed for us to use the pub and Age UK are now looking for a volunteer to help run the group. It will potentially be one Tuesday afternoon a month.

### **Youth**

On Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March we were joined by work experience student Harry, who is studying a Public Services Course at College. Harry joined us to speak with residents at The Hub at the library and we took him out on patrol around the parish. Harry then spent time with the Billingshurst, Horsham Town and Southwater Wardens, completing a full week with the warden team.

On Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March, we joined Dan Fairchild HDC's Youth Provisions Officer and Billingshurst Warden Julie Green at The Weald School where we gave a presentation to the Year 7 students about our plans to start a joint Youth Forum for Billingshurst and Pulborough Parishes. We were really pleased to have 6 young people show an interest in joining. We hope to give another presentation to Year 8 students and also to year 6 at the primary schools in both parishes.

## Dog Related Issues

We have received a complaint of dogs not being kept under control whilst walked in woodlands off Hill Farm Lane. This has also been reported to Sussex Police and we ask then when walking dogs in the local area that they are kept under close control.

Although not reported to us directly we note that there are problems in the Stane Street Close area with a resident not picking up their dog mess. Please remember to clean up after your dog. There is no such thing as the "Dog Poo Fairy"!

The Pulborough Pantry continues to go from strength to strength and our continued thanks go to Maria Lee, Nichola Rogers and the team of volunteers.

During early March Louisa was contacted by Bettina Long, one of the Southwater Wardens, who has heard about the success of the Pulborough Pantry and is trying hard to persuade Southwater Parish Council to set up a similar initiative. On Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> March Louisa met with two Southwater Parish Councillors Chris Pearce and Steve Lewis and talked to them about the pantry and how it has evolved in such a short time. Maria, Nichola and Len Ellis-Brown then spent time talking to Chris and Steve.

Maria arranged a Pantry Volunteers Meeting on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> March at The Sports & Social Club which Louisa also attended. It was great to see potential new volunteers and hear about other projects in the pipeline.

### Pulborough Shedders

The Shedders continue to go from strength to strength, with new members joining. We called into see the group on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> March, to ask if they could sharpen some gardening equipment for an elderly resident. It was great to see so many people at the "Shed". It was a real hive of activity with hedgehog houses being made and bug hotels, a bowl being made on a lathe and a trailer being fixed. There was a real buzz in the air.

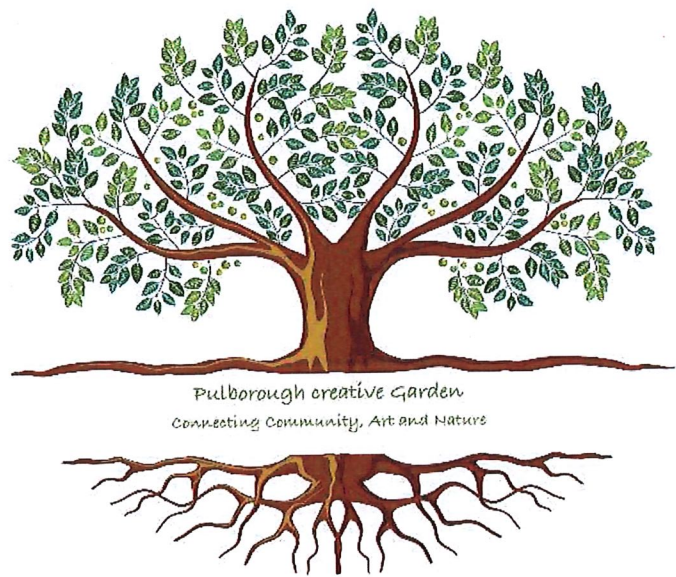

We will be holding our first working group meeting soon.





## ASB

Over the Easter weekend it was reported that 3 males had been seen throwing stones at trains from the railway bridge at Church Place. This is the second incident of this nature and is deeply alarming. We carried out some enquiries and names have been passed on to both British Transport Police and Sussex Police.

We also received a call from staff at Newey Nurseries to say that vandalism had been caused to some of the greenhouses on site with more than 40 panes of glass smashed. This has also been reported to Sussex Police and we have conducted additional patrols at the site.



## Parking/Vehicles/Road

### Parking/Vehicles

We received some complaints about parking in Church Place during April. Due to the car park at the old Catholic Church now being blocked off more cars are parking along the road. Although there are no parking restrictions in place, we do ask that drivers are respectful of driveways to neighbouring properties and do not park too close to the bend by the railway bridge where Church Place joins Coombelands Lane.

### Road

We received an e-mail from a concerned local about a structure located in the lay-by on the A283 between Pulborough and Wiggonholt where it is believed someone is living. Although the lay-by falls under Parham Parish Louisa visited the location with Storrington Warden Chris Poore. A male at the location who had been homeless and sleeping at the location in the past was spoken to. He stated he had now been housed but still likes to visit the location and his old caravan as he has nowhere else to store it. Chris has contacted Turning Tides who support the homeless to see if the male is living back at the site. Louisa has made a report to West Sussex County Council as the lay-by is believed to fall under the highway boundary.

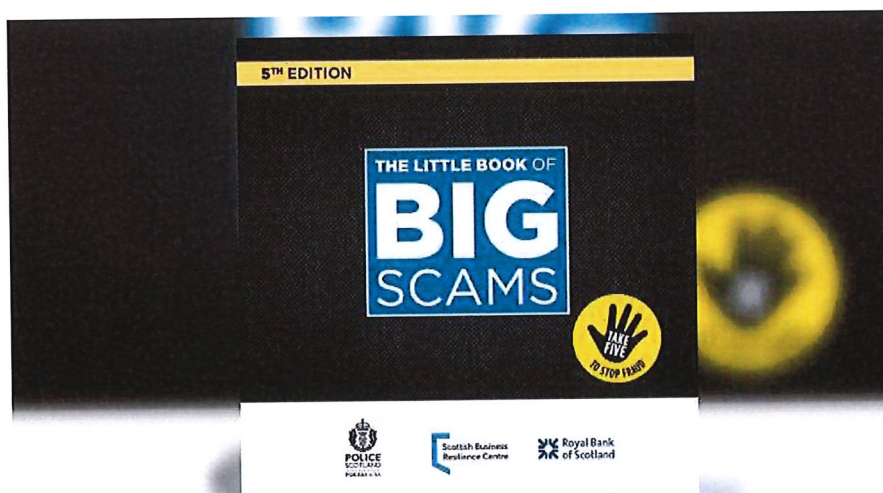

## Scam Awareness Talk

## Vulnerable Persons Visits

April has involved quite a few visits to vulnerable members of our community who sometimes need a little extra support. These have included neighbour issues, cost of living concerns, IT issues, an elderly resident who had not been seen for some time and a suspected rogue trader visit. We have spent time contacting Sussex Police, Housing Associations, GPs, social workers and support workers. This is a large part of our role and one that we cannot always report on for confidentiality reasons.

## Dog Related Issues

After receiving a complaint about a loose dog getting into a neighbouring property, we visited the dog owners and gave words of advice.

We were also contacted for advice about a dog barking and sounding distressed at a property in the village. Advice was given regarding contacting the RSPCA and the Registered Social Landlord (RSL) who owns the property was also notified.

Although not reported directly to us we are aware of issues with dog mess not being picked up in the Stane Street Close area. We have liaised with the housing manager for the area who is investigating this.

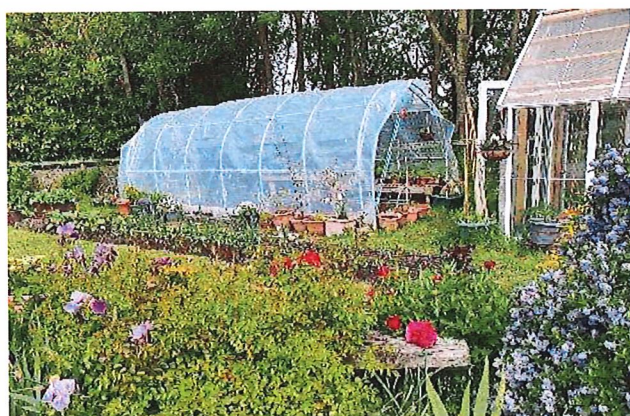
### Blocked Pavement in Glebelands




## **Pulborough "Journey" support group for parents and carers of children with Autism and Special Educational Needs (SEN)**

## **Report on the Purchase of a New Vehicle for Pulborough Parish Council**

### **Introduction**

Pulborough Parish Council has identified the need to purchase a new vehicle for Fred, our Groundsman. After extensive research and consideration of our budget, it has been determined that a pickup, utilitarian type of vehicle would best suit our needs. This vehicle will be stored overnight at Swan View and used exclusively for technical purposes during working hours.

### **Budget and Funding**

Councillor Hare and I have diligently worked to identify a long-term solution that fits within our financial constraints. Currently, we have a budget of £11,000 allocated for this purchase. Additionally, we are in the process of having our tractor valued, as it has become redundant due to the mower adequately handling its previous responsibilities. We anticipate that the sale of the tractor will generate approximately £6,000, bringing our total available funds to around £17,000.

### **Vehicle Selection Process**

We have conducted a thorough review of suitable vehicles within our budget, resulting in three quotes for pickup utilitarian vehicles that meet our requirements. Councillor Hare, with his extensive experience in trade vehicles, has played a crucial role in ensuring that detailed checks and evaluations were performed on each option. Our research was comprehensive, and we are confident that the vehicles identified are the best available choices.

### **Consideration of Electric Vehicles**

While considering various vehicle types, we assessed the potential of acquiring an electric vehicle. However, it was determined that this option is not feasible for our current situation. The lack of necessary infrastructure in our area, coupled with the limited real-world benefits and market options, makes electric vehicles impractical for our specific needs.

### **Recommendation**

Given the rapid turnover in the used vehicle market, it is imperative to act swiftly to secure a suitable vehicle. Therefore, I recommend that the Council grant Councillor Hare and I the authority to make the final decision on the vehicle purchase. This will allow us to promptly acquire a vehicle that meets our criteria and avoid the risk of losing potential options that may no longer be available if delayed.

In conclusion, the purchase of a new pickup utilitarian vehicle is essential for the efficient operation of our technical services. With the combined funds from our budget and the anticipated sale of the tractor, we are well-positioned to acquire a suitable vehicle. I urge the Council to approve our recommendation to expedite this process and ensure that we secure the best possible option for Pulborough Parish Council.
