ASB

On Saturday 10th February a report was received that a bin had been stolen from a residential property in Church Place and thrown over the railway bridge into the path of an oncoming train. Not only was this act anti-social behaviour but it was also an extremely dangerous criminal act. The consequences could have been catastrophic. Local residents reported the incident to British Transport Police for investigation. PCSO Lisa Bowley and Louisa carried out enquiries into the incident, area searching for the suspects. Louisa spoke with the Network Rail Incident Response Officer who attended the railway line and removed the obliterated bin and a number of road cones from the line. Names of a group of three young people seen in the area at the time were obtained and passed to the Police.

On Tuesday 13th February another attempt was made by a young person to steal a refuse bin, again in Church Place but the quick thinking of a nearby resident prevented any further attempts to throw the bin on to the line.

We are very saddened that such dangerous behaviour has taken place within our parish this month and urge parents to talk to their young people about where they are going and what they are getting up to.

We have been made aware of further issues about poor parking around St Mary's Primary School at drop-off and pick-up. We ask parents to please be mindful of private driveways, not parking too closely to junctions or the roundabout at Cousins Way/Nutcroft and to not park on the verges causing visual obstructions. Our Civil Enforcement Officers in our parking team have been made aware as has PCSO Bowley.

Whilst out on our vehicle patrols in Nutbourne we came across a branch across the road which was difficult to see due to its position round a bend in the road. We cut back the branch to make it safer for passing motorists.

Warden Swap

On Friday 23rd February Louisa swapped places with Oscar, one of the Horsham Town wardens. Oscar spent the day in Pulborough patrolling with Ross and they spent time visiting the Little Monkeys playgroup. Louisa patrolled Horsham Town centre with colleague Maria, speaking to shops, members of the Street Drinking community and shoppers. Louisa even chatted to local Pulborough resident Dennis who had taken a trip up to Horsham on the Pulborough Community minibus!

Older, Vulnerable People and Youth

Older/Vulnerable People

This month we supported a vulnerable, elderly resident to sign up to the Community Link service. Community Link is a support service from Horsham District Council that enables residents to live independently, by providing affordable access to a range of assistive technology (Technology Enabled Care).

The resident now has a Digital Lifeline Alarm and Pendant to use in their home that enables emergency assistance, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The Lifeline acts as a personal alarm to keep the wearer in touch with reliable help at all times, allowing them to feel safe, while maintaining independence. By Simply holding down the button on the pendant to be digitally connected to the monitoring centre which is staffed by professionally trained operators.

Dog Related Issues

Dog fouling issues remain a problem in Pulborough, as with much of the UK, with some owners not being responsible and picking up after their dogs. Whilst we have not had many reports made directly to us, we have picked up on residents' frustrations in the areas of Stane Street Close and Cousins Way from posts made on the Pulborough Village Facebook page. We are monitoring these areas whilst on our patrols.

Dog mess is not only deeply unpleasant, but also dangerous. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizures.

As wardens we do have the powers to issue Fixed Penalty tickets to those who we see not picking up after their dogs, but we'd prefer that it was just cleared away!

Please remember:

When you walk your dog, be sure to take poo bags with you, the same as you would remember a lead. Please note, rain does not wash the problem away.

Refurbishment of Carpenters Meadow Play Area

Having hand delivered over a hundred questionnaires, we were pleased to hear that 40 replies were received from residents about the refurbishment of the Carpenters Meadow Play Area. Even greater news is that there are 5 residents that would like to be part of a working group with us, Councillor Paul Clarke and Anna Chapman HDC Parks & Countryside Development Manager to discuss and plan a design so that the Parks team can draw up a specification to go out to tender.





Training

Warden Team Meeting – Parkside

On Tuesday 6th February we attended our quarterly full warden team meeting at Horsham District Councils offices at Parkside, Horsham with supervisor Carol Boniface. The meeting enables us to update the other warden schemes about our community projects and to share ideas and best practice. We also receive inputs from other teams within the council. This month's meeting gave us the opportunity to meet our new Director of Service Andrew Smith (Head of Housing and Community Services). Andrew will be joining Ross and I out on patrol one afternoon in March.

We also had a useful input from our Community Safety Colleagues Shelley Gosden and Lucy Hargreaves about Contextual Safeguarding.

Contextual Safeguarding is an approach to understanding and responding to children's experiences of significant harm beyond their family and home. This approach recognises the different relationships children have in their schools, peer groups, online and in their community.

Suicide Prevention Training

In February Louisa completed a 90-minute course by LivingWorks Start in conjunction with West Sussex Mind. LivingWorks Start trains participants to recognize when someone may be thinking about suicide and how to connect them to help and support. LivingWorks Start was developed with input from experts in suicide prevention, education, psychology, public health, social work, faith communities and the military.
