YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

Chairman's report

The last 3 months have been relatively quiet.

We are continuing to work with our preferred Design and Build team and with all the user groups in formulating a plan for the new sports pavilion. As soon as a design has been agreed and finance has been put in place we should be then in a position to consult with the parish.

The Neighbourhood Wardens are continuing to address many issues in the village that arise involving both young and old. We have "signed up" to having them with us during the whole of 2018/2019 so you will see be an increase in the Parish proportion of your new rates for 2018/2019 which is estimated to be in the region of £4 to £5 per annum for a Band D property.

All residents should now be aware that the new waste collection arrangements will start in February; the main change is that the household bins will now be collected once a fortnight instead of once a week.

All potential sites which may come forward for development in the Neighbourhood Plan have now been visited by the Steering Group and a Housing Needs Survey has been carried out. Both of these issues will be on the agenda for the next Neighbourhood Plan meeting next month.

The village market seems to be going from strength to strength and I would encourage all residents to visit at some time this year; I am sure that they will find the effort worthwhile.

The Council at its last full meeting agreed to sign up to the "What if? Community Resilience Programme. The purpose

would be to formulate a proper response in the event of a major disaster within the parish and to have in place a programme to deal with it in the unlikely event that one should occur.

As I finish my report, the rain which has been relentless over the past 48 hours, may well test the "What if" programme sooner than we anticipate!!!!!

Wishing all my parishioners a good start to 2018 and hopefully for the sun to make an appearance.

Fairtrade Fortnight

26th February-11th March

Fairtrade Fortnight will soon be here and this year we are celebrating West Sussex being granted Fairtrade County status. To find out more about what this means and about your local council's action plan on Fairtrade, you are invited to attend a meeting at Ede House, County Hall, Chichester on Thursday 1st March at 7.30 pm. Fairtrade refreshments will be served from 7pm.

The two-pronged theme for this year's Fairtrade Fortnight is "Come on In" and "Make your Break Fair": the first invites you to attend local events where Fairtrade refreshments are served; the second encourages you to consider how you can include Fairtrade in your daily routine. Here are a few ideas to get you started.

How to put Fairtrade in your break:

When we reach for our favourite food and drink each day without thinking about where it comes from, we may be feeding exploitation. We become part of the problem, but we can also choose to be part of the solution.

Your morning brew: Whether it's English Breakfast tea or a skinny latte, always look for the Fairtrade Mark on the packet. You'll find Fairtrade choices in most supermarkets.





Commuter coffee: Before you pop into your usual high street coffee shop, double check to see if their coffee is Fairtrade certified. If you aren't sure, then ask the barista or tweet the store. Remember, you have the power to make companies source sustainably through your choices.

A little pick-me-up: Whether you are going healthy with a banana or sharing out a block of chocolate around the office, your choice can make the difference. Look for the Fairtrade Mark, and if your local shop doesn't stock what you want, ask them to

If I knew you were coming: You can use Fairtrade ingredients in plenty of recipes. There's a Fairtrade choice for everything from cocoa to sugar paste, from vanilla to icing sugar. So whatever style of cake you create you can make sure it does good as well as tastes good.

LOCAL SCHOOLS

St Mary's CofE (Aided) Primary School

What a busy Autumn term it has been and although the temperature has dropped nothing has stopped the warmth and energy in school with such a lot of fantastic opportunities that have been offered to the children.

Year 6 went to Newhaven Fort and had an Evacuee Day where the staff and the pupils dressed up and participated in a day of activities around Anderson shelters, rationing, cooking, aeroplane making, sewing and learning about real life evacuees that stayed in Pulborough – what a brilliant way to immerse the children in their learning.

In addition to this they had a Science Enrichment Day which started with an inspiring talk from Harley Gasson who is an engineer at Maclaren and then allowed the children to explore science with acid and alkali tests, making and testing rockets and hovercraft and making circuited doodle bugs.

Year 5 had a planetarium from Herstmonceaux observatory come to visit to bring Space to life. They were so enthused by the information that they had learnt and this has shown in their writing and the enthusiasm to go on and read more!

Year 4 children have ventured into the Raiders or Traders topic with a Viking Forest Schools Day. This involved cooking and making griddle cakes, hessian bags, making candles from Beeswax, making rope braid and whittling willow spears. One child commented, 'I love the outdoors and I have done so many new things that I have never tried before.'

The love of History continued for Year 3 with a Stone Age day in the woods with the children making their own paints to make Stone Age paintings, clay pots, fire lighting and looking at bones.

Year 2 have been learning about The Great Fire of London, it culminated with the children building their own houses from the time and then testing the weather conditions that made the fire spread so quickly. The houses were taken up to Forest Schools for this experiment and the children were in awe as the houses burnt.

Year 1 children have been working on traditional tales with our school initiative of 'Talk for Writing' as well as some visits out for a community projects with Hillside Lodge. UK and Austria class have been learning up at Ingfield Manor as well to raise the children's awareness of disabilities and how we can all work together.

It has been fantastic to have welcomed Father Paul over the past few months and the children have enjoyed his assemblies and worship.

A Greek banquet was held after the children made a variety of Greek dishes.

The Spring term has started and we have a lot planned with the Polar Explorer STEM initiative and enhanced Science across the school, cornet lessons, Greek Day for Year 5, the choir heading to the O2 to participate, World Book Day, visitors to enrich the curriculum as well as Forest Schools and additional sports activities before school and at lunchtimes.

Your recycling will be collected one week and your household waste will be collected the same day the following week. Garden waste will continue to be collected fortnightly for those who have subscribed to this service



Pulborough Minibus
