From your Parish Council

CHAIR REPORT



'm pleased to be taking over as Chairman of your parish council at a key time in the evolution of our village. Right now, our draft neighbourhood plan has just come back

from Horsham District Council where it has been for 8 weeks for a 'health check'. The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group will now review that feedback and consider any amendments needed. It is anticipated that the draft plan will then be published this autumn for a six week public consultation period. Comments received will be reviewed and any further amendments made. It will then be resubmitted to Horsham District Council, who will undertake a further six week public consultation period. Feedback from that will be reviewed, and any final changes made. A referendum will then be held when you will have the opportunity to vote in favour or against it. If 50% or more of votes are in favour, the neighbourhood plan will be 'made' and become a legal planning consideration document.

This plan, if 'made', will become our shared vision for the development of our community in Pulborough and all the hamlets that make up the parish. It's important for our community that we have this document because it puts us in control of the planning and growth of our village. Central government is demanding that communities build an ever increasing number of houses in the South East of England. Neighbourhood plans cannot oppose development. Our neighbourhood plan will propose controlled growth in sensible areas and will preserve the character of our historic village. Every one of us needs to engage

Parish council work isn't just about the serious side of planning and development. We also have a role to fulfil in providing recreation facilities and amenities in our parish. I'm excited about a fun project which combines exercise and recreation with education and will be launched at the end of July. The Pulborough Giant is coming to town! This WildArt Trail is a guided walk with art and sculpture along the way, and it is supported by an augmented reality app featuring the Pulborough Giant. It starts at the station, goes along Church Place, Old Rectory Lane and the top of Glebe Field, dropping down into Lower Street and then onto the Wild Brooks where it finishes at the RSPB. I believe this project will give Pulborough a significant boost by bringing tourists into the area. It should benefit our traders and shops in Lower Street.

In other news, comment has been made about fly tipping of grass cuttings in Rectory Lane. As the authority responsible for highways and public rights of way, West Sussex County Council has been notified and is dealing with the issue. WSCC asks that all residents remember that garden waste should be placed in 'green' bins or taken to the amenity tip.

I'm taking over as chairman of a council which is well organised and has run your parish smoothly in recent vears. It's a tribute to my predecessor. Ray Quested, and I'd like to thank him for eight years of unstinting service as your Parish Council chairman. Ray is continuing to work on projects which he initiated and is Vice Chairman. Finally, we have vacancies for three parish councillors since the elections in May when three colleagues stood down. It's an exciting time to be a parish councillor. OVERGROWN VEGETATION ON FOOTPATHS



he Parish Council often receives comments about overgrown vegetation encroaching onto footpaths. The lovely summer weather together with some heavy downpours in between, has brought with it the usual June / July growth of foliage. It can be very difficult for

pedestrians, especially those with pushchairs, wheelchairs or more limited mobility, to use the pavements when ground vegetation, hedges or branches are obstructing their passage. West Sussex County Council is responsible for maintaining land that it owns alongside roads and paths but it is the landowners' responsibility to keep overhanging vegetation from blocking footpaths. There are also responsibilities around controlling or removing certain invasive or noxious plants such as giant hogweed, which mainly grows near riverbanks, ragwort and Japanese knotweed.

May we politely remind residents to check their property frontages and cut back vegetation from their boundary if it's causing a nuisance please? Please remember also that the bird breeding season runs until the end of August, so hedges and trees containing active birds' nests shouldn't be disturbed.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH (NHW)

With the ever increasing strain on the resources and priorities placed on Police Forces across the country, the National Neighbourhood Watch Network (NWN) now plays a vital partnership role with Sussex Police, and other Agencies, to ensure the ongoing safety and well-being of our communities and residents.

a bit more about the benefits it brings to the local community. 'We welcome carers, those they care for and anyone needing company and we are dementia friendly. The surroundings are welcoming, accessible, bright and airy and offer a safe environment.

We aim to vary the activities on offer: apart from puzzles, board games, and picture books, we have musical interludes and (thanks to our Parish Council Wardens) we have had visits from Horsham District Council's Virtual Reality Team. However, the most important part of the morning is the human contact, interaction and conversation. For carers and those who are a bit lonely, we aim to give support and company and try to help put things into perspective. For those cared for, we offer stimulation, help to delve into the past and bring out memories but above all, enjoyment. We aim to have fun and pack in as many laughs as possible.

We feel it a great privilege to be able to offer that important listening ear to those who need it. We have a good number of willing helpers, so we can provide an almost one to one service of love and care. One of our regular visitors says, "The cafe has given me a lifeline with friendly, caring support, laughs, coffee and cake. It was great to be able to share concerns, while my partner was given attention elsewhere in the room. As a non-believer, I was a little wary to begin with because of the church association, but immediately found that this was irrelevant. The volunteers offer unconditional support and I continue to return and be welcomed after losing my partner."

ello to everyone and here's to the warm weather – at last! We've been very busy behind the scenes these past couple of month supporting residents within the parish. We've made home visits, made phone calls, made referrals and have been doing a lot of organising for the coming months! There's been a lot of engagement within the community with young and older residents alike and of course those most vulnerable. We've been trying to get our step count up and have been doing a lot of foot patrols in this lovely weather. If anyone fancies trekking around the village then please let us know as we know all the lovely routes to take.

Behind the scenes we've been working with a company to try and get a pump track (bike track) into the village for the summer holidays. We've managed to secure some funding to host a track for a week in August. If it's successful and well received then we'll look at what we can do to have it more often. We've also secured the Shoretrax bike track to come back to the recreation ground in August. This is always hugely successful so we'd always welcome anyone wishing to offer their time to help with a long-term plan to get something more permanent. There will be further sports sessions on the main recreation ground for the 21st and 28th August to include football and dodgeball and alongside the Shoretrax earlier in August, that's every Wednesday covered in August. If there's a sport you'd like to see in particular in the village then please let us know and we'll see what we can do.

Our colleagues in Storrington have unfortunately had to undertake an emergency rescue of a dog left in a hot car in the middle of the day. They managed to save the dog and get it to the local vet but this is a reminder to never leave your pet in a car in the heat – not even for a minute. Advice from the RSPCA is to take your dog with you when you leave your car or leave it at home. Even if it's only 22° outside, it will quickly reach 47° inside the car within an hour. Call 999 if you see a dog in distress in a hot car which is locked up.
