## ASB/crime/criminal damage

- Assisted resident with incidents of verbal abuse from a neighbour. An E-cins case was opened to share information with other agencies. Intelligence shared with Police officers prior to attending the property.
- Reports received that young people continue to ride bikes on a car port roof. We are working with the residents and facilities manager to gather information and identify those involved.
- Assisted British Transport Police with vulnerable male enquiry. Follow up visit to home address to ensure support was in place.
- Resident signposted to Police to report suspected drug dealing from a property.
- Reported a company sign on display to Horsham District Council for being in breach of a Community Protection Notice.
- Spoke to young people responsible for a fly tipped sofa. They were asked to remove/return item.

## Parking/vehicles

- Driver advised regarding parking on a pavement and vehicle was moved.
- 4 x incidents of anti-social parking outside the school. 2 x reports of driver without seatbelt. 1 x report of driving whilst using a mobile phone. All reported to Sussex Police Operation crackdown.

## Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

- 5 x fly tipping reports submitted to WSCC for removal. Located in Nutbourne, Swan Bridge and Glebe field area.
- Request for a camera to be placed in area where repeated incidents are occurring to gain evidence of the offenders.
- 5 x potholes reported.

## Community engagement/events/meetings

- Engaged with school children and parents for road safety week. HI VIS stickers and wrist straps were given out and we spoke about the importance of being clearly seen by road users when walking and riding bikes to and from school.
- Op Magpie (Sussex Police burglary prevention) talk given to residents at the Library for the Monday Hub group.
- Attended knife crime and county lines conference at Horsham District council. Valuable insight gained to guide professionals working with young people and families in communities.
- Meeting with a young person keen to help set up a project to get a bike pump track in Pulborough.
- Attended quarterly Community Safety team meeting to include corporate plan priorities and updates from each department.
- Attended monthly warden meeting - an opportunity to share good practise and plan seasonal awareness topics to deliver locally.

## Patrols (foot/visible and car)

- Mobile patrols to cover Nutbourne, Black gate lane, Pickhurst lane, Broomers hill, London road, Gay street lane and Stane street.
- Foot patrols to Primary School, recreation ground, Cousins way field, Glebe fields, Station road, Train Station, Church road and London road.
- Targeted patrols to monitor fly tipping and train departures/arrivals of local students.

## Elderly and youth

- Liaised with NHS social prescriber to support elderly male with decline in his mobility alongside some equipment to support him at home.
- Spoke to a resident about the benefits of participating on a mobility scooter training session as safety concerns were raised.
- Signposted and advised a resident to contact adult safeguarding to share concerns for a vulnerable male.
- Spoke to young people about the steps to take for a Pulborough bike track.

## Cycling

- Engaged with cyclists about lighting and appropriate clothing to be seen during the winter months.

## Parish specific/other

- Joint interview with Parish clerk for WSCC to explain how Operation watershed provided funding and equipment to make improvements at Pocket Park to include attracting wildlife and revitalising the area for the community.
- Tweeted about Hashtag Ourday which is a Horsham District initiative to promote the positive work that ourselves and other departments deliver in our communities across the District.
- A working group led by a young person has been formed to look at the processes for raising funds and an application to have a Pulborough bike track.
- Delivered Road Safety week; predominantly at the school but also engaged with dog walkers, horse riders and cyclists.
- Attended a road traffic accident involving a serious injury to a cyclist and directed the traffic at a busy junction until the emergency vehicles arrived at the scene.
