ASB

We have had numerous reports of young people behaving antisocially in one particular development in the Parish. We have conducted twice daily patrols in the area but have unfortunately not witnessed the behaviour. We have identified one of the young people and are actively working to ID the other. We have passed our information on to Sussex Police and are waiting to hear back from them as to where they are in handling the situation.

There has been an individual riding a motorcycle around the village dangerously, using pavements, footpaths and recreation grounds as their chosen area. There have been serious concerns for safety, and we have identified the individual concerned and passed our information on to Sussex Police. We are again waiting to hear back from them as to where they are in handling the situation.

Parking/vehicles

We have been approached by members of the United Reform Church (URC) in Lower Street to see if we can help them with a parking issue outside their church. Cars are parking on the paved sections of the pavement and causing safety issues with sightlines, particularly when leaving the car park.

The land is not owned by the Parish Council and Horsham District Civil Enforcement Officers (CEOs) do not have the authority from West Sussex County Council to enforce this. We are therefore working with other parties to see if we can resolve this situation.

We are getting increasing numbers of calls from residents in West Chiltington, a Parish that we do not unfortunately cover. In these situations, we will still try to help, signposting or giving advice where necessary, but one such call has been from a delightful elderly gentleman who has needed assistance with various matters of concern to him and us. In one instance, he was having trouble with login details and passwords to important websites, and we were able to help him with these issues. Moving forward, we have found a kind and helpful resident of the village, who has agreed to visit and help the gentleman with any further IT issues.

Youth

We successfully ran our 'Summer Sports' on the main recreation ground during the holidays, which had good attendance and plenty of newcomers to the event, which was great. We are investigating options for next year and considering doing a one-day event similar to some of the other ones held by our neighbouring colleagues in the district.

Dog related issues

We have unfortunately had a few calls this month regarding anti-social behaviour and more worryingly, dangerous dogs - Any attacks by dogs need to be reported immediately to Sussex Police. Their advice is that if there is an immediate threat to human or animal life to call 999.
