## ASB/crime/criminal damage

- Report received that young people were breaking fences in Pocket Park. Patrols increased in the area with good engagement with young people
- Resident signposted to Environmental Health to report a residential noise disturbance from a neighbouring property.
- Visit to commercial premises to advise re ASB on the site.
- Joint working with the Police to tackle ongoing ASB within the village

## Parking/vehicles

- Driver advised regarding parking on a pavement outside property and vehicle was subsequently moved
- Resident reported misuse of parking bay in residential road, information being gathered
- Elderly resident reported vehicles regularly blocking a dropped kerb and causing access issues. Parking alerts issued and the situation has been resolved

## Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

- 1 x fly tipping reports submitted to WSCC for removal. Located in Coombelands Lane

## Community engagement/events/meetings

- Attended monthly warden meeting - an opportunity to share good practice and plan seasonal awareness topics to deliver locally.
- Attended monthly village market – Great for meeting community members and sharing concerns
- Carried out visits to businesses in the village to introduce myself and pass on contact details - ongoing

## Patrols (foot/visible and car)

- Mobile patrols to cover Nutbourne, Blackgate Lane, Pickhurst Lane, Broomers Hill, London Road, Gay Street Lane and Stane Street.
- Foot patrols to Primary School, recreation ground, Cousins Way field, Glebe fields, Station Road, Train Station, Church Place and London Road.
- Targeted patrols to monitor fly tipping hot spots and train departures/arrivals of local students.
