ASB/Crime/Criminal Damage

There have been no new incidents of ASB to note.

There have been 7 incidents of cars being 'rummaged' whilst left unlocked on driveways at around 0200 hrs. One item of value taken. Residents encouraged to call Police. We continue to monitor.

Parking/Vehicles

1 x specific complaint regarding junction parking at Rivermead. Advice given. Difficult to deal with as no parking restrictions.

Fly tipping/Littering/Graffiti

1 x report received of rubbish dumped on private land. Seemingly to avoid traveller entry and placed strategically for that reason. Horsham Planning leading re potential enforcement under the Town and Country Planning Act section 215.

Community Engagement/Events/Meetings

3 x sports sessions held on main rec to include football/dodgeball/shoretrax/disc golf. Attended by a core group of 8-14 young people.

1 x clear up day at Carpenters Meadow. This was a multi-agency approach which was attended by Saxon Weald, Pulborough Brooks Baptist Church, Sussex Police, Pulborough Wardens and some residents. It was a great success and residents say it's made a huge difference to the area.

Regular swimming sessions held at St Marys School for the community. Attended by a volunteer and very well received in the community with most sessions sold out!

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

50 hours of foot patrol – 22 miles!

16 hours of vehicle patrol (mainly evenings during hours of darkness) – 213 miles covering most roads within the parish on a regular basis. This also includes dedicated pre-arranged enquiries/meetings/visits to residents. Approx 10 miles per day. The perimeter of the parish is a 12 mile round trip. Just for info.

Elderly and Youth

We've received 3 reports of vulnerable older persons who may need support and after contact with Freddie Jones, the NHS social prescriber, we've found they are already on his radar and receiving relevant signposting.

Meeting with a family with children needing support around behaviour. Signposted to relevant agencies.

Cycling

We've engaged with a YP regarding his anti-social use of his cycle and considerations around his safety whilst out in the community. The Police have been involved and have advised they will remove his cycle if he's found to be riding dangerously or anti socially. Parents are aware and on board with this.

Parish Specific/Other

3 x reports made to Public Rights of Way (PROW) to get footpaths/bridleways cleared as very overgrown. One was cleared by the landowner immediately which was the path alongside Strawberry Field up to the Nurseries.
