Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

We reported seven incidents of fly tipping to include a vacuum cleaner, some cannabis plant remains and human fouling! We also had reports of a lot of litter by Duncan's Pond. This is private land and we engaged with the land owner to see what we could do to help.

Community engagement/events/meetings

We worked with the Community Partnership to look at events for the coming year. We put our feelers out to the public and came up with some wonderful projects for the spring/summer.

We resourced a shed for a new Mens Shed initiative and we continue to work on this venture.

We also resourced some land for a Community Garden and are working gathering volunteers and momentum to push the project forward.

The Pump Track project is gaining speed and the group involved is making great progress with research and community engagement.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

We continue our mobile and foot patrols (weather permitting) and aim to visit/tour the whole parish every shift to show a presence.

Elderly and youth

The calls to our older and vulnerable residents continue and we are still signposting and supporting vulnerable residents with signposting and support.

Licensing

Dog related issues

One incident of dog fouling in Stane Street Close which we addressed through social media engagement and recruited a new volunteer to help with spraying any fouling found.

Cycling

Parish specific/other

We have:-

Liaised with Storrington and Billingshurst Wardens regarding drugs information that affects the 3 parishes.

Been working with Storrington Wardens around a suspicious driver with no licence and relayed this to the Police.

Worked with Saxon Weald and parish council regarding a householders bins that have been placed on council land which obstructs access.

Shared information with a social housing provider about a residents concerns for their neighbour's property.

Put in a report to housing regarding the condition of neighbour's property and concern for the family.

Given Covid - 19 guidance given to a resident following the sudden death of family member.

Given advice given to a resident home manager around suspicious activity within the block.

Spoken with a family around concerns about their child randomly door knocking on residents and concerns for their safety in doing so.

Been working with the Pump Track Project organisers to give advice and guidance.

Engaged with adult social care regarding concern for a vulnerable resident who is new to the village.

Received community funding vouchers from Sainsburys to gift families/local projects

Engaged with adult social care regarding concerns for a vulnerable resident and completed a referral.

Liaised with WSFR regarding a hoarding/fire safety concern at a property.

Completed a training course in fuel debt advice.

Given advice to a resident who lost some money in the village.

Worked with a local resident and have been donated a Mens Shed and a Community Garden!
