

# From your Parish Council

#### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**



I hope this report finds everyone well in this continuing difficult time.

Since the conclusion of the Neighbourhood Plan Reg 14 public consultation at the end

of August, work has been ongoing to analyse representations made. It is hoped that very shortly the final version of the Neighbourhood Plan will be ready to submit to Horsham District Council for the next round of public consultation.

The Council has also been looking at the Government consultations for proposals to change the current planning system. It's pleasing to note that Neighbourhood Plans still have a role to play in the new proposals; but it's of great concern to also learn about the impact these changes will have locally on Horsham District Council regarding the proposed number of new houses which will need to be built each year. Our representations to the Government consultations will object strongly to the proposed number of new houses, and I am conscious that other organisations, including Horsham District Council and the Campaign for the Protection of Rural England (CPRE) are also objecting.

Representatives from the Parish Council have been involved in discussions regarding the A29 in Pulborough in terms of volume/type of traffic and vehicle/non-vehicle user issues generally. A list of priorities for potential projects of improvements has been drawn up, putting major priority into Swan Bridge and Corner as well as Pigeon Gate Bridge. We are working with West Sussex County Council to identify how projects can be taken forward and funded.

A pre-application planning proposal has been submitted to Horsham District Council for the sports pavilion rebuild/ refurbishment project and we have also finalised a business plan document for the project.

Our Finance and Policy Committee is starting work on our budget and precept for next year. We will budget for all the services which your Parish Council is responsible for delivering and has taken upon itself to provide as a service to our community. These services include the provision of Neighbourhood Wardens and Community Youth Worker, playground and outside gym equipment (and their safety inspections/maintenance), floodlight and enclosed sports pitch (suitable for 5 a side football and netball), a groundsman to keep all council owned land maintained, grass cut and strimmed, and sports pitches prepared, allotment

provision and maintenance, cleaning of bus shelters and street furniture.

This current year's budget has included the provision of Christmas trees in December for many of the Lower Street and Station Street traders. The businesses/ premises signing up to the scheme make a small contribution but the overall cost to the council is much higher – we hope that this scheme for the community helps to bring some cheer and encourages people to shop in Pulborough.

You may like to know about the Government's new Rural Gigabit Broadband Voucher Scheme. The scheme allows a joint application for multiple users, eg a group of neighbours, to apply for a voucher to pay local suppliers up to £4,000 per household. The deadline for applications is 31st March 2021. 

#### **NHS COVID-19 APP**

Download the new NHS COVID-19 App to help prevent the spread of coronavirus. The app allows you to report symptoms, order a coronavirus test, and check into venues by simply scanning a QR code. You can download it from the App Store or Google Play. It is still vitally important that to protect yourself and others, when you leave home you must:

- wash hands keep washing your hands regularly
- cover face wear a face covering over your nose and mouth in enclosed spaces
- make space stay at least a metre away from people not in your household

If you are feeling unwell, get a test and do not leave home for at least 10 days.



#### Your local school ST MARY'S CE (AIDED) PRIMARY SCHOOL

What a strange time it is! We are doing our best to make the school day as normal as possible for the children and they are adapting extremely well to the changes.

We were delighted that we were able to welcome Fr Paul, Mr Holloway and Mr Hancock into school for a socially-distanced Harvest Eucharist last month. Although we could only have a few children in the hall due to the restrictions, the service was live-streamed to all the classes so that they could take part. It was great to hear some singing again after all this time, the children in the hall sang and the classes hummed along quietly!

We are very keen that the children are able to take advantage of any good weather to get outside and exercise, so were very



pleased that the weather was good for our Invasion Games event. This was run by coaches from Horsham District Council with other schools due to compete over the coming weeks. With the dry weather and the field in perfect condition, the older classes completed a number of challenges in basketball, football, rugby, hockey and netball, practising the different skill sets associated with these sports. Great energy and enthusiasm was shown by all and a big thank you to the coaches from Horsham District Council for running the event

We are hoping to run our next 'Virtual' event soon where the other classes in

Also in Year 6, as part of a collaborative photo-realism project, the children in SA class have produced an amazing portrait of Nelson Mandela in the style of Chuck Close. Each child worked on a small section of the picture, then all the pieces were put together to create the finished picture.

#### **FRAUD ALERT**

Elderly and vulnerable people across Sussex are again being warned to be wary of phone calls from fraudsters pretending to be from HM Customs and Revenue (HMRC).

Genuine authorities stress that people will never be texted or phoned out of the blue with requests to make payments, to log in to an online account or to disclose PIN numbers, passwords or bank details. Anyone receiving such contact is advised to hang up and report the call – preferably using a separate mobile phone or landline in case the criminals have kept the line open – to Police on 101 or Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040. Please ensure that any of your potentially vulnerable friends or relatives are fully aware and alert to the risks. For further advice, please visit the Sussex Police website. www.sussex.police.uk



## TEST AND TRACE SCAM ALERT ISSUED BY COUNCILS

The Local Government Association says councils have received reports of fraudsters attempting to exploit the system through bogus phone calls, emails and text messages which ask for bank card details to cover the cost of the testing kit. The genuine NHS service is free.



#### SAFE SPACE FOR VICTIMS RELAUNCHED

Safe Space Sussex website is an online directory of local victim services, created by Police & Crime Commissioner Katy Bourne. In response to the 'lockdown' and concerns raised around crimes like Domestic Abuse, this website has been upgraded and advice has been shared on social media (@SussexPCC) to help victims covertly reach out for help whilst stuck in isolation – search #SafeSpaceSussex. Safe Space Sussex has been equipped with a new search tool so that within 10 seconds, victims of any crime can find the service they need. It also has a 'leave site now' button that users can press to quickly exit the site.

Victims can also covertly let Sussex Police know they are in danger. The '55' technology is in place for those too scared to speak, to alert a call handler to the fact they need help by pressing 55 on their mobile phone once they've dialled 999. www.safespacesussex.org.uk
