ASB/crime/criminal damage

We have offered reassurance visits and patrols in Lower Street following on from a recent robbery at a store which involved an alcohol theft and at a second shop which had its windows smashed and wine stolen. We have also liaised with the Police regarding these incidents.

Ross conducted patrols and reassurance visits in and around Barn House Lane following reports of anti-social behaviour in the area with bins being knocked over causing noise and littering problems.

Several reports were received in late July regarding gatherings in the memorial gardens and Lower Street Car Park, with loud music being played, and items being taken from the charity bins. We have increased patrols in the area to try and establish who is congregating in the area and are encouraging local people to report the issues to Sussex Police.

Parking/vehicles

We have received complaints about parking around St Mary's Primary School at school drop off and pick up which we have monitored. Like Carol & Vanessa, our predecessors, we hope to work with the school and PTA around this when the new school year starts in September.

We have spoken with a local resident about speeding concerns along Lower Street and Mare Hill Road. PCSO Jake O'Donovan has been contacted about the status of a Pulborough Community Speedwatch Group. Several sites have been approved in Pulborough but more volunteers are still needed. The Pulborough Community Partnership have also been spoken to with regards to the progress of two fixed Speed Indicating signs for Lower Street.


Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

We have continued to patrol the perimeter roads and rural locations within the parish that are popular with flytippers and are pleased to report we have not seen any fly tipping.

We have carried out litter picks at the area of the Brooks known as "The Beach" (just outside the parish) after a gathering and subsequent fire. We have also carried out a litter pick in Pocket Park and in the memorial garden/Lower Street carpark following an increase of reports of anti-social behaviour and drug use in the area.

We also attended the scene of a grass fire on the West Glebe field and liaised with West Sussex Fire & Rescue from Billingshurst. They believe the fire may have started from a discarded cigarette or from the sun heating up a discarded beer bottle. We have highlighted these issues on social media to improve our reach to residents.





Community engagement/events/meetings

We attended the Community Volunteer Forum meeting on 12th July which was a very useful information sharing and networking opportunity. It was a great to be able to speak with the attendees about the community projects that we are currently working on.

We held our quarterly Steering Group meeting with the Parish Chairman and Parish Clerk to discuss current issues within the parish and our focus for the next quarter.

We attended a full warden meeting at Horsham District Council to share ideas and solutions to community issues with the other warden schemes.

We have liaised with a Neighbourhood Watch Street Co-ordinator about concerns around abandoned vehicles in their street and anti-social behaviour from a neighbouring property.

Louisa met with Tay Pardoe, the new Horsham District Community Agent for Age UK and her colleague Hayley. This was a useful meeting to discuss the variety of services that Age UK can provide to Pulborough residents and how referrals can be made, and Louisa updated them on the various groups and clubs held in the parish.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

We have continued with our vehicle patrols of fly-tipping hotspots in the outer lying areas of the parish and in Nutbourne.

We have focused our foot patrols in our ASB hotspots, such as the Recreation Ground and Pocket Park, Lower Street Car Park and our fire hotspots such as the Glebe fields.

Elderly and youth

We have finalised details of the Boxing programme for 11- to 17-year-olds to start here in Pulborough in September. This will be held in the school hall at St Mary's Primary, and we hope to replicate the success of Wardens Julie & Barry's scheme in Billingshurst. The sessions will start on Wednesday 14th September and will run for an hour from 5:30pm - 6:30pm. We have begun to promote the sessions on social media, via The Weald School and via the poster we have had designed.



Louisa spoke with a group of young people trying to have a Barbeque on the recreation ground which is prohibited under the Parish Council byelaws and asked that it was extinguished. The young people were quite vocal about the fact that there isn't anywhere suitable for them to meet in the parish to have a barbeque.

Louisa visited the Wednesday Lunch Club to discuss the possibility of the wardens holding a scam talk there once the group returns after the summer break.

Licensing

We have received no licensing related issues in July.

Dog related issues

We have received a complaint of a young person walking a dog during the early evening along Lower Street through the East Glebe field and back through the recreation ground not picking up their dog mess and dropping litter and we are investigating this.

Cycling

We have received no cycling related complaints during July.

Parish specific/other

Two found purses have been handed into us and both were promptly reunited with their owners.

Louisa completed her Community Safety Accreditation Scheme (CSAS) training during July so was away from the parish for a week but now has the relevant powers designated by Sussex Police to assist in her duties as a warden.

Both wardens also had some annual leave.
