E-CINS: Online confidential multi-agency sharing of caseloads.

Operation Crackdown: Joint initiative with Sussex Safer Roads Partnership and Sussex Police to report abandoned vehicles or anti-social driving.

SCYP: Sussex Clubs for Young People.

ASB: Anti-social behaviour.

HASBRAC: Horsham Hate Crime and ASB Risk Assessment Conference.

DPA: Directed Patrol Activity (Sussex Police)

Section 59: Allows the police to give drivers a warning if they are reported to have used their vehicle in a manner which causes "alarm, distress or annoyance". If reported to have done so again within a year the police have the right to confiscate the vehicle.

ASB/crime/criminal damage

- 4 x intelligence reports submitted into the Police relating to incidents of crime. CCTV captured enabled identification of persons involved.
- Report received of young people disturbing stool ball training and games. Patrolled during the session times and engaged with groups in the area.

- Reports received of anti-social e-scooter use on roads and pavements. Evidence being gathered for enforcement after warnings issued and repeated incidents.
- 2 x Operation crackdown reports:
 1. Dangerous driving
 2. Driving without a licence
- Working with resident to help find solutions to improve poor parking in The Moat/Moat lane area.
- Police advised about information received of suspicious behaviour seen in a private car park.

Parking/vehicles

- Joint working with the Police regarding dangerously parked vehicle.
- Working with resident to help find solutions to improve poor parking in The Moat/Moat lane area.
- 3 x parking alerts left on poorly parked vehicles.

Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

- 2 x large potholes reported
- 1 x fly tipping report (Nutbourne).

Community engagement/events/meetings

- 5 x free summer sports sessions held on the recreation ground. Good attendance and positive feedback received.
- Talking Tent project – 4 x sessions for young people and families to get information and awareness on emotional wellbeing and accessing mental health support.
- SCYP – Weekly youth Purple Bus sessions attended.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

- Mobile patrols of the whole parish during every shift targeting hot spot areas.
- Increased foot patrols to check open spaces - grounds/playground equipment and to engage with groups gathering.
- Joint patrols with other warden schemes.

Elderly and youth

- 2 x welfare checks for older vulnerable residents. Relevant referrals submitted.
- Completed Acts 435 funding request for vulnerable resident in need of bicycle transport.
- Joint visit with Police to support young person and family.
- Young person agreed to an Acceptable Behaviour Contract following ASB in the community. This is regularly reviewed alongside other interventions and support.
- 1 x safeguarding report submitted.

Licensing

Dog related issues

- Advice given to resident following a report about not keeping their dog under control.

Cycling

- Reports received of anti-social e-scooter use on roads and pavements. Evidence being gathered for enforcement after warnings issued and repeated incidents.

Parish specific/other
