CHAIR REPORT



ve written a lot about Pulborough Neighbourhood Plan recently. We had expected the Pre-Submission Plan to be out for public consultation this autumn,

but it now looks like it will be early in the new year. We have been delayed because we await the Strategic Environmental Assessment report and feedback from potential site owners. Sign off from Horsham District Council is then required before we are authorised to conduct public consultation.

Our Finance and Policy Committee is starting work on our budget and precept for next year. We will budget for all the services which your parish council is responsible for delivering and has taken upon itself to provide as a service to our community. These services Include the provision of Neighbourhood Wardens and Community Youth Worker, playground and outside gym equipment

(and their maintenance), floodlight and enclosed sports pitch (suitable for 5 a side football and netball), a groundsman to keep all council owned land maintained, grass cut and strimmed, and sports pitches prepared, allotment provision and maintenance, cleaning of bus shelters and street furniture, provision and maintenance of hanging baskets in summer and Christmas trees at Christmas.

Finally, we are approaching Armistice Day and will again support the Remembrance

by erecting two Tommy silhouettes. We will also lay wreaths at the church and in our memorial garden.

FAIRTRADE CELEBRATES 25 YEARS!

n 1992 the Fairtrade Foundation was established by a group of charities including, Traidcraft and Oxfam. Two years later Cafédirect, Clipper, Percol



and Green and Black launched the first Fairtrade products carrying the Fairtrade logo in the UK.

In 2019, awareness is at an all-time high, 9 out of 10 people know the Mark (see it in the Fairtrade Village logo below) and it is trusted by 84% of consumers. From modest beginnings in 1994, the Fairtrade Mark is now visible on around 5,000 Fairtrade-certified products on sale for people in the UK giving us all the opportunity to show our support for the 1.6million farmers and workers behind the UK's most visible ethical label who grow our favourite things.

Michael Gidney, Chief Executive of the Fairtrade Foundation, said: "Twenty-five years ago most brands paid little attention to the human cost of their business and most people were unaware of the poverty and degradation that was the reality of life for millions of farmers and workers around the world. Fairtrade set out to change that and put people and the planet before profit. Many said it couldn't be done, but the public took Fairtrade to their hearts and into their shopping baskets from Day One. Together we led a revolution in the way food is traded. Millions around the world now benefit from fairer trading terms and better working conditions than would ever have been possible before."

Pulborough has been a Fairtrade Village since 2007 and that status has been renewed every two years since then, showing that our commitment to Fairtrade continues to grow.

Lodge Hill is proud to be recognised by Schools, WSCC and other charities as providing facilities and an environment that can be enjoyed by and contribute to the development of young people and adults of all abilities.
