ASB/crime/criminal damage

- May has seen an increase in calls and e-mails received to the wardens about anti-social behaviour in Pulborough. This has included damage to vehicles, thefts, anti-social use of a quad bike, eggs being thrown at people and vehicles and other unacceptable behaviour. We have worked hard to encourage residents to report all incidents to Sussex Police to help gather evidence to support action being taken against those individuals involved and to increase Police patrols in the area. We have attended several multi-agency meetings with representatives from Sussex Police, Housing, West Sussex County Council and Community Safety to look at what action that can be taken.
- We have logged a large amount of information on the E-CINS reporting system which Sussex Police have access to, providing information needed for enforcement action.
- We have also monitored local social media pages to gather information about what is happening locally and to monitor community tensions.

Parking/vehicles

- We have been monitoring parking issues along Lower Street.

Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

- We have monitored fly tipping hot spots during our patrols and one report was made to HDC's Hopoast Depot.

Community engagement/events/meetings

- Ross attended the "Welcome to Pulborough" meeting to introduce himself to new Pulborough residents.
- Ross attended the Annual Parish Meeting to meet with Pulborough Parish Councillors and members of the public.
- Ross and Louisa visited the Monday Community Hub and spent time talking to the attendees about the role of Neighbourhood Wardens and also discussed any issues people had and found out about general Pulborough life and activities attended.
- Louisa attended the May village market alongside Carol Boniface. This was a great opportunity for Louisa to meet with key members of the community, Parish Councillors and representatives from a variety of organisations. PCSO Lisa Bowley from Horsham Police who covers the Pulborough Parish, alongside other areas, also attended so it provided a chance to discuss local issues.
- Louisa and Ross attended a scam talk in Storrington presented by Storrington Wardens Chris Poore and Alison Page, which was also attended by PCSO Joel Beasley. This is something that the Pulborough Wardens are looking to organise in Pulborough too as it has now been some time since Carol and Vanessa held similar talks here. With scams evolving all the time this is something that is important to keep local residents updated about.
- Ross has introduced Louisa to lots of local businesses and members of the community and this will continue over the coming months.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

- Mobile patrols to cover Parish boundaries: - Nutbourne, Blackgate Lane, Pickhurst Lane, Broomers Hill, London Road, Gay Street Lane and Stane Street.
- Foot patrols of the whole village with a view to being visible and approachable
- Targeted vehicle patrols to monitor fly tipping hot-spots and train departures/arrivals of local students.
- Targeted foot patrols to monitor areas of village where current anti-social behaviour issues have been reported.

Elderly and youth

- We attended a meeting with Dan Fairchild, HDC's Youth Provision Officer and Julie and Barry, the Billingshurst Wardens to find out more about Youth Councils and Youth Forums. Dan has started a Youth Forum in Horsham to engage with young people and to discuss local issues. We are looking at ways to start a Youth Forum here in Pulborough.
- We have started to plan some sporting activities for young people over the summer holidays.

Parish specific/other

- On our return from the scam talk in Storrington we came across two trees hanging down across the road, along one of the side roads, which posed a hazard to other road users. We flagged down a passing workman who luckily had a chainsaw in his vehicle and with his help we cleared away the branches and subsequent debris from the carriageway.
- We assisted at the scene of an incident involving a bus and van under the railway bridge by the railway station. We checked those involved were unhurt and whether they needed any assistance and helped to calm those at the scene.
- As Louisa joined in the middle of May she has been carrying out her initial Warden training as well as working alongside Ross out in the community. Ross has also completed further internal training courses as part of his continued professional development and other external courses that further the warden's role e.g Bystander Intervention and Rest Centre Management.
