ASB

On 29th March we attended a Community Trigger meeting regarding drug and noise related anti-social behaviour at a property in the village. We are working with the housing provider, Sussex Police and other support services to try and deal with the issues which are impacting neighbouring residents.

Parking/vehicles

After raising our concerns about parking issues around St Mary's Primary School at a joint meeting with HDC's Parking Services, further concerns were raised by District & Parish Councillor Paul Clarke. Parking Services Civil Enforcement Officers attended and conducted patrols during the second half of the month.

Community engagement/events/meetings

Young People Matter Event

On Wednesday 1st March we attended a Young People Matter event held at Hurst Cafe in Horsham. The event saw 60+ delegates and 9 pupils from local schools and organisations come together to share ideas and discuss youth provision in our District.

The event provided us with a brilliant networking opportunity with representatives from organisations such as West Sussex County Council, Sussex Police, 4TheYouth, Allsorts Youth Project, West Sussex Mind, and other members of our Horsham District Neighbourhood Warden team. It also gave us the chance to discuss what matters to Young People and to hear from pupils from Millais, Bohunt and Tanbridge House School who had given their time to attend.





Steering Group Meeting

On Monday 6th March we held our quarterly steering group meeting, that had been postponed from late January due to the landslide. We met with the Parish Council Chairman Ian Hare and our supervisor Carol Boniface and discussed the current Parish and District Council priorities and the community projects that we are working on.

School Lunch visits

We continue, where possible, to visit St Mary's Primary school during their lunch break play sessions, to engage with pupils across all year groups. Our intention is, over time, to get to know all the pupils and for them to see us as trusted people in the community.

Messy Church

We visited the Pulborough Brooks Baptist Church's 'Messy Church' session on Saturday 11th March. We were made to feel very welcome by those attending and were invited to join them for some food at the end of their session.

Courier and Impersonation Fraud Webinar

On Wednesday 15th March Louisa took part in a webinar arranged by West Sussex County Council's Community Safety & Wellbeing Team about courier and impersonation fraud. Courier fraud has now become the most reported type of fraud in West Sussex and we are keen to improve our knowledge on scams and fraud so that we can keep local residents updated and protected as best we can.

The A29 landslide was still very much the topic of conversation, alongside Terri Ashpool's wonderful Macmillan Easter Egg tombola!

Craft Café

One of our regular events to visit is the wonderful Craft Café, hosted by the United Reformed Church in Lower Street. Our most recent visit on Tuesday 28th March was a busy one as we met with HDC Copywriter Hannah Goodall who is writing an article about us for RHtwenty magazine. Also running was a presentation by a SECAMB Community First Responder who gave the group some CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) training and demonstrated how to use the new defibrillator that has been funded by the United Reformed Church and placed on the wall near to the entrance.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

During March we have carried out our usual patrols of the parish. During our vehicle patrols we have paid attention to our fly tipping hotspots and outer lying roads. During our foot patrols we have been monitoring issues with signage and potholes and reporting our concerns, along with those of the residents, to WSCC Highways.

Older, vulnerable people and youth

Older Persons Groups

On Wednesday 8th March Louisa visited The Wednesday Club at the Village Hall. It was our first visit this year and the number of attendees was lower than on previous visits, so we are making sure we promote this wonderful village group when we are visiting our older residents. Louisa spent time engaging with some of the group over a game of Dominoes and then spent time talking about community issues over lunch.

Vulnerable People – Community Link Visits

We are working in partnership with Horsham District Council's 'Community Link' team visiting clients who have lifeline personal alarms and pendants in their homes. The visits enable us to get to know our older and vulnerable residents better. During the visits we have been checking that the installed equipment is working correctly and seeing if those visited need referring to other services. It also provides the opportunity for us to make them aware of some of the groups running in the village that they may like to visit, to prevent social isolation.

Youth

Our Youth Boxing Programme has had its last session of the term and its last session at its current venue of St Mary's Primary School, and we are incredibly grateful that the school has been so supportive of our programme and its goals for the young people in the community.

To be able to grow the project, it is moving to the Village Hall off Lower Street (same day/same time).

There are many reasons behind the change of venue, but principally, we will hopefully be able to fix brackets to the walls of the main hall, to hang punch bags from, which will allow for the natural progression of the young people's skills and development, but also, the new venue will allow the programme to continue if we are not present. At the moment, we are having to work on our rest days, or come in and open/close the school in our free time to ensure that the sessions run.

On Tuesday 14th March we had a meeting with one of HDC's Community Safety Officers Shelley Gosden, where we discussed youth provision and safeguarding concerns around some young people and a project for Pulborough where we are looking to work with some residents to become "Community Guardians" to help build a stronger community, champion the views of those around them and bring about positive change.

Dog related issues

We have been conducting patrols on the main recreation ground and Cousins Way recreation ground to monitor the dog fouling issues we have been made aware of, which are having a negative impact on the sports clubs who use the grounds.

We revisited the tent early the following week and left a note inside, offering assistance, if it was required. Having not heard back and subsequently received messages to say that the tent was in the highway, we removed the tent on Friday 24th March and are safely storing it and the items of clothing from inside in case the owner comes forward.
