ASB/crime/criminal damage

- Reports received relating to groups of young people
 - 1. Door knocking and being verbally abusive to occupants
 - 2. Damage to playground equipment on the main recreation ground
 - 3. Knocking over rubbish bins in different locations
 - 4. Gates/fencing damaged on East Glebe fields
 - 5. Bike ramps and digging causing damage to the land at The Moat, Historic Monument Site. Ongoing work alongside landowners and the Rural Policing team to resolve the issues.
- Noise disturbance from illegal Traveller encampment on the recreation ground vehicles, dogs and noise from generators at late hours. A large amount of litter/waste was left behind and cleared.
- Reports of suspected drug supply. Intelligence shared with the Police and letters sent out to residents to encourage reporting the issues.

Parking/vehicles

• We continue to monitor parking at busy locations i.e. school and surrounding rounds, Lower Street (Dominos).

Fly tipping/littering/graffiti

- Large amount of Litter/waste cleared after the Traveller caravans left the recreation ground.
- Reports of litter left behind by the bench on The Moat.
- 2 x potholes reported, and support given to a resident outside of Parish re concern over a pothole.

Community engagement/events/meetings

- Considerable time invested in helping to set up and gather interest for the Men's Shed project.
- Ongoing work and support around the bike Pump Track project and engaged with landowners about suitability of land to be used as a temporary bike track.
- Attended the Village Market for our 'meet and Greet' and engagement with visitors.
- Weekly positive engagement with young people alongside our Youth Worker during the Purple Bus sessions.

Patrols (foot/visible and car)

- We do mobile and foot patrols of the Parish during every shift and targeted patrols to areas experiencing anti-social behaviour.
- Joint patrols with PCSOs at hot spot locations.

Elderly and youth

- Multiple referrals made for a vulnerable resident who has come to our attention.
- 2 x safeguarding referrals for young people.
- Referral to our social prescriber following a concern raised by a resident for a vulnerable household.
- Advice given to young person regarding the use of e-scooters in public spaces.
- Joint visit with HDC Community Link team for resident with broken alarm and pendant.
- Advice given to older person following 'cold callers' in their street.
- Information sharing with Social Services and partner agencies to assist family with complex needs.
- Supported residents with mobility aids in her property via Saxon Weald tenancy support.
- Information given to a lone shop worker about a GPS footprint pendant.
- Liaised with partner agencies and neighbouring warden schemes to share concerns around vulnerable young people.
- Supported vulnerable resident with access query.

Licensing

Nothing to report.

Dog related issues

 Numerous complaints received relating to the illegal Traveller encampment on the recreation ground and their dogs not being kept under control/ or not clearing up their waste.

Cycling

• As above – bike ramps built on the historic site, The Moat.

Parish specific/other

- Funding obtained from the Police Property Act Fund and donated to Sussex Clubs for young people.
- Another resident was encouraged to sign up to Adopt-A-Street.
- Arranged funding for a resident wishing to host a heritage weekend.
- Joint working with PCSOs regarding young people riding dangerously around the village on motorcycles.
- Assisted with enquiries and managing community tension relating to Travellers on the recreation ground.
